<b>Title</b>	<b>MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowship 2023</b>
<b>Aim</b>	The goal of MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships is to enhance the creative and innovative potential of researchers holding a PhD and who wish to acquire new skills through advanced training, international, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary mobility. MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships will be open to excellent researchers of any nationality. The scheme also encourages researchers to work on research and innovation projects in the non-academic sector and is open to researchers wishing to reintegrate in Europe, to those who are displaced by conflict, as well as to researchers with high potential who are seeking to restart their careers in research

<b>MAJOR CHARACTERISTICS</b>	
<b>Scope</b>	<p>Fellowships will be provided to excellent researchers undertaking international mobility. Applications will be made jointly by the researcher and a beneficiary in the academic or non-academic sector.</p> <p>Postdoctoral Fellowships either can take place in Europe (i.e. in an EU Member State or a Horizon Europe Associated Country) or in a Third Country not associated to Horizon Europe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>European Postdoctoral Fellowships</b> are open to researchers of any nationality who wish to engage in R&amp;I projects by either coming to Europe from any country in the world or moving within Europe. The standard duration of these fellowships must be between 12 and 24 months.</li> <li>• <b>Global Postdoctoral Fellowships</b> are open to European nationals or long-term residents who wish to engage in R&amp;I projects with organisations outside EU Member States and Horizon Europe Associated Countries. These fellowships require an outgoing phase of minimum 12 and maximum 24 months in a non-associated Third Country, and a mandatory 12-month return phase to a host organisation based in an EU Member State or a Horizon Europe Associated Country.</li> </ul>
<b>APPLICATION PROCEDURE</b>	
<b>Application materials</b>	<p>The <b>electronic submission system is an online wizard</b> that guides you step-by-step through the preparation of your proposal. The proposal itself consists of <b>2 main parts</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>administrative forms</b> (structured information of the basic administrative data, declarations of partners, organisations and contact persons, etc.)</li> <li>• <b>technical annex</b>, which is the detailed description of the planned research and innovation project outlining work packages, costs, etc.</li> </ul> <p>Further mandatory or optional annexes (e.g. supporting documents for ethics issues, detailed budget table for lump sum pilot projects) can be required by the call and the given topic, as shown in the submission system.</p>
